

## Sports Premium Report - September 2019



### Intent

We are expecting to receive approximately £18,000 for the financial year in a dedicated Sports Grant from the Department of Education. Godstone Primary and Nursery School has continued to build upon and deliver quality PE Provision. This funding will be used to enable the school to continue to make additional and sustainable improvements to the PE offer. Emphasis will be placed on CPD for staff, purchasing age appropriate PE equipment, provision of internal/external sporting clubs and to improve the competitive sporting opportunities for the children.

- We are able to offer appropriate PE and sport activities to for all age groups, increasing pupil engagement and ensuring all children are given access to opportunities to try a variety of sporting activities that they may otherwise not access
- We are able to maintain high quality PE provision for the school in future years
- Our PE subject leader is effective in monitoring sport provision across the school and is up to date with current best practice
- Our Teachers are given the opportunity to have CPD opportunities and share skills learnt with teachers within the school. CPDs will be undertaken by a variety of staff to allow lots of opportunity for individual development within the school.
- The School participates fully and competitively in locally organised and age appropriate festivals and competitions and promotes/encourages inter school sports events
- Continue to widen the range of age appropriate and varied equipment we have in school
- Grow on the success of the 2018 Summer Term Sports Day; continue to expand and encourage family engagement and participation in sporting activities arranged by the School.

### Implementation

- Audit the PE curriculum and make adaptations to include a wider skills based curriculum
- Link with Active Surrey and Tandridge Schools to achieve a 'School Sports Mark' for 2019/2020 at a Silver/Gold Level
- Make continued use of an 'Active Surrey Membership'
- Purchase new sports kits for children representing the school at events
- Purchase specialised sports kits for staff
- Hold weekly celebrations where sports teams are praised for their achievements
- Offer a wider range of sports participation opportunities for the children to engage with
- Develop the provision of table tennis and tennis
- Hold termly inter-house sports competitions
- Liaise with SENCo regarding the use of OT, fine motor and gross motor support
- Initiate a plan of selecting children to represent the school at District Sports
- Improve swimming outcomes for the children
- Participation in competitive locally organised festivals and competitions
- Continue to develop Sports Day and engage parental participation
- Create a 'Young Sports Leaders' programme and initiate leadership from the children

- Continue to develop community links in areas such as Cricket, Swimming, Tennis, Forest School and Gymnastics as well forging new links
- Ensure that transport to and from events is arranged with parents so that all children can attend

### Impact

Through the implementation of the above we anticipate that the impact will be:

- An improvement in the PE and sporting activities on offer for the children which will in turn enhance pupil engagement
- Ability to maintain high level quality PE provision for the school in future years
- Ensuring that the PE subject lead is effective in monitoring sports provision and is up to date with current best practice
- Staff confidence through training/CPD
- A wide and varied range of sporting equipment on offer to the children so that they can access sports effectively
- Instil a sense of pride in the children when representing Godstone Primary and Nursery School at sporting events
- Maintain and enhance links with parents and the wider community

### **Effect of the premium on pupils PE and sports participation and attainment**

Godstone Primary and Nursery School has continued to build upon our aim of developing the rigour and quality of our PE provision. We achieved the School Sports Mark Silver award in 2016, improving on our previous two bronze awards, which recognises and celebrates the improvements made.

Participation in extra-curricular clubs has improved. Dance club has been extremely popular, with many pupils from Years 2 to 6 attending.

Through our links with our local cluster of schools, we have further developed our participation in sports festivals and competitions. These provide regular opportunities for high quality inter-school (level 2) competitions in a range of areas, from netball to athletics. Improvement in the number of

requests from pupils to enter inter-school competitions has resulted in an increased number of teams being entered for the second year running.

**Pupils with physical difficulties are being supported further within lessons with the introduction of activities learnt from their entry in the Pantathlon and the purchase of specific resources.**

Year 5 and year 6 pupils who have attended sports leaders training are involved in planning and delivering sports activities for the younger pupils throughout the school. As a result, physical activity levels increased at lunchtime.
