Why read with your child at home?



Reading a book and chatting about it has a positive impact on children's ability to:

- understand words and sentences
- use a wide range of vocabulary
- develop listening comprehension skills

Why does reading together every day matter?



The number of books your child has encountered by the age of six is a positive predictor of their reading ability two years later.

This benefit comes from:

Adults reading to children and children enjoying books simply by looking at them and talking about them.

What are we hoping to achieve?

- ❑ To raise the profile of reading at GPNS.
- ❑ To increase the number of children who engage with reading outside of school.
- ❑ To create a 'love of reading' that goes beyond their time at GPNS.

How does it work?




Homework


Welcome to your home away from home, Wetherdown Lodge!
